## The Star of David

The Star of David is a union of two triangles, but can be viewed laterally as well as vertically. Vertically gives a union of fire and water, laterally gives a union of earth and air.

With the exception of Scottish aprons, the MM's apron shows the prelude to the union of fire and water. The triangular flap begins to intersect with the triangle formed by the three rosettes and the Master/Past Master's apron leads into the Holy Royal Arch: the three levels are also three triple Tau's and again form a representation of water intersecting with the triangular flap, leading to the completion of trial by fire and water, seen earlier with the two pillars united in the Fellowcraft Degree.
